Have you ever given a gift so wonderful that someone carried it with them the rest of their lives? That's what giving just one pint of blood will do. Too many people wait until they or their family needs blood before they truly realize the importance of donating blood. As your community blood provider, Lafayette parish hospitals use more than 1800 pints of blood each month. Sunday's are an important day to our blood supply. Many area hospitals have Tuesday as a primary surgery day, which means more blood products are required that day. Because it takes two days to test each pint of blood, your donation means blood is available for "surgery Tuesdays". When you donate blood, you ensure blood "replacement fee coverage" credits are available for your parishioners and family members. **CEMETERY Q&A**

**Q: What kinds of flower arrangements may and may not be placed on a tomb?**

**A:** We allow the placement of living and artificial flower arrangements on a tomb according to the following stipulations:  
1.All flower arrangements must be placed

in sturdy, durable pots on (not around) the tomb. Objects of a permissible nature that are placed on a tomb must be firmly secured against wind; those that continually fall off a tomb are subject to discarding by St. Peter's.

2.Pots holding vegetation may be discarded if broken, excessively aged, or unattractive.

3.Family members should be diligent in removing dead flowers as their decay is a major contributor to tomb decay. Dead or dying vegetation that is deemed an eyesore or a lure for insects may be discarded without prior warning. Artificial flowers that are excessively aged may be discarded.

4.Flower arrangements may not be placed around tombs as doing so impedes upkeep.

**REMINDER:** The only cemetery gate that will be opened for use between September 22nd and November 2nd will be the gate that opens to the parking lot behind the church. During this time all visitors should check in at the office to verify payment of cemetery dues and to obtain a permit to clean, paint or repair a grave. No one is allowed to do any cleaning, painting or work on a tomb without first contacting the office.

**CEMETERY NOTICE:**

Many individuals visit the cemetery in October to prepare graves for All Saint's Day. This year we will be vigilant in making sure that all entering the cemetery to clean and/or repair a tomb are current with their cemetery dues. NO WORK may be done on a tomb, INCLUDING CLEANING, if cemetery dues are not current. A free work permit is required before any cleaning or repairing of a grave may be done. It is important to also understand that you may not clean or repair a tomb of a relative unless cemetery dues on that tomb are also current. We have begun enforcing this long- standing policy. Please contact the parish office to verify that cemetery dues are current on any tomb owned by you or your relatives.

### EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

"On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark..." John 20:1

#### Mary on Easter Morning

Mary Magdalen went to the tomb on Easter morning while it was still dark, when it was not yet evident that Jesus' story was unfinished that the most glorious chapters remained to be told. Her steps there must have been heavy, her heart even heavier. No skipping, no singing - just duty and a sense of respect for the man she knew was different, really different, in spite of the fact that he was now gone, in spite of the fact that disillusionment was probably creeping into Mary's thoughts as the executioner's words echoed over and over again; "If you are God, come down from that cross... Save yourself. If you are really God..."

It had to have been a dreadful time for Jesus' followers, a time when many were thinking, like the two on the road to Emmaus, "We had put our hope in him," as though all hope was now in the past, like a withered rose petal pressed between the pages of a fairy tale.

Yet...Mary walked to the tomb, and it was there that the risen Jesus revealed himself to her, and her heart, once heavy, now danced to tell the Good News to his other followers still hiding in the darkness. We must do the same. We must follow Mary's example...when going to Mass seems an empty experience, when making time for the rosary and family prayer takes on a certain mundane listlessness, when reading the Scriptures and sacred literature is not as appealing as other pursuits, when seeking the Lord sometimes seems like groping through the night. It is at times like these that we must remember Mary on Easter morning and like her make our way through the darkness to the "tomb" in blind faith, for it is there that we meet the resurrected Jesus. "Come to me, all who are burdened," he tells us — burdened with doubts about the efficacy of our prayers, with temptations to stay away from our religious practices, with physical and spiritual laziness that dulls our willpower. When we answer Jesus' call, he does his part, rolling away the stone that weighs us down and giving us new wings for the journey. Lord Jesus, when life seems more dead than alive, help me to remember Mary on Easter morning; help me to keep keeping on, ever expectant of Resurrection Day! Amen.
