Learning What Meekness Means

Maybe it's the fact that I grew up in south Louisiana where rainfall's usually plentiful, and the green is vibrantly green, but for whatever reason, I've never liked the desert. Too dry, too prickly, too barren. Just the thought of it makes me long for the sound of thunder and the fresh smell of rain clouds scudding in from the Gulf.

No small wonder that I'm not fond of spiritual deserts either the seasons of the souls when the consolations of the Lord have totally evaporated and when everything in the inner life seems shriveled up and fruitless.

A meteorologist once said, "Drought breeds drought." If that's the case in the physical world, I can surely relate to it in the interior life, one season of dryness following another in frustrating succession. As a writer of inspirational stories, one of my greatest joys is sharing with others the wellspring of God's love in my life and in the lives of people who tell me about their experiences of His mercy. As a Christian I feel compelled to spread this good news of the Lord's presence among us, and it's a trial of faith when I'm stymied in that attempt. But it happens. The flow of ideas and experiences diminish to a trickle and then stop altogether. The doors of opportunity for writing and for publication slam in my face. Prayer time becomes so arid it's hard to maintain focus during Holy Hour vigils, the recitation of the Rosary, and celebration of Mass. Eventually, even relationships with others are affected as a sense of loneliness and isolation sinks in. Spiritually, it's extremely daunting.

At one such time in my life when I was "lost in the desert," a friend dropped by with an unexpected gift. She had rediscovered a very old book which she'd rescued years before from the dumpster, an aged little volume that a librarian of an archival collection was discarding. My friend couldn't bear to see that happen, so she snatched it up and brought it home to her book storage closet where it stayed for the next twenty years.

"I want to pass this book on to you now," she told me. Written by the great Eucharistic saint, Peter Julien Eymard and published at the beginning of the 20th Century when he was still "Venerable," the book was entitled, **The Eucharist and Christian Perfection**. From the onset, I sensed there'd be something special in it for me. I wasn't wrong. Later, as I thumbed through the yellowed pages, I was drawn to a chapter about meekness. Sure enough! It spoke directly to my withered heart that was struggling through an ongoing season of drought.

The good saint wrote:

"We must be meek before God. God is at times severe. He hides His goodness under an irritated exterior. He appears to hold back His help, to stop the channels of grace. He allows nothing that we undertake to succeed, even those things that are for His glory....Then we are discouraged, and in disgust we give up everything. Sadness lords it over us with impatience. We feel secret irritation boiling up in our soul. It is then that one must be meek before God, for all that comes from Him. Meekness will make us say to Him, 'My God, I know thou art as good as thou art just. I accept everything from thy hand. I adore thee in this mysterious way and in all thy good pleasure concerning me, for I know that all comes from thy paternal heart.' We suffer, but we are submissive and we serve God as on the days he turns to us the radiant sunshine of His face. God is conquered by this meekness of the submissive soul. He yields, for the experience He desired to make is over. He wanted to see whether we love Him more than His favors."

A cup of cold water! That's what St. Peter Julien Eymard's words were to me. Refreshment, revitalization, renewed understanding, new life. Everything that had gone to seed started to make sense in light of the saint's wisdom. God, I realized, had stopped the flow of favors to see if I valued my relationship with Him more than the fruits of that relationship. "Do you love Me for Who I am or for what I can give you?" God was confronting me. He was calling me to meekness, to acceptance of the whole package, regardless of the prickles it contained, so long as Jesus was holding the bag.

Clearly, the prayer of St. Peter Julien Eymard had to become my own! "My God, I accept everything [even this season of dryness]; I adore thee in this mysterious way and in all thy good pleasure concerning me, for I know that all comes from thy paternal heart."

With that, the desert didn't seem so barren any more. Instead, it was filled with the quiet presence of the Lord who was offering me far more than mere gifts. He was offering Himself and waiting patiently for my response. How foolish, I realized, to keep crying for rain when I could have the Rain-Maker, the Rain Bearer.

The desert and I at long last, were coming to terms of peace with each other.

tyrannical and self serving. And we often forget that at our Baptism we are all anointed priest, prophet and king. So what is the true function of a king?
